Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Public Services

WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE THIS STUDY PROGRAMME?

This A level equivalent qualification specialises in focusing on the appropriate skills and understanding to pursue a career in a public service area. For anyone interested in a career in one of our public service forces, this would be well accompanied by Criminology.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

There are three mandatory units and three optional units to make up the course.

Across the range of units covered, some will be assessed from internal assignments, practical participation and delivery or external examination.

Mandatory Units:

- Government Policies and the Public Services
- Leadership and Teamwork in the Public Services
- Citizenship, Diversity and the Public Services

Optional Units:

From a range of units, three units will be chosen which best suit the cohort and course delivery.

Some of the units available are: Understanding Discipline, Physical Preparation, Expeditions, Crimes effect on Society, Major Incidences.

WHAT COULD THIS QUALIFICATION LEAD TO?

This qualification could lead to Higher Education Degree Courses, or support applications into a range of public service sectors, such as the police, army, fire service, council/local government or criminal justice.

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WHAT WILL BE EXPECTED OF ME?

- Read and research
- Keep a record of the information you find and the sources
- Plan your work in a logical order and keep a record of your progress
- Talk to your teachers about your ideas and how to achieve the best results
- Produce drafts and final copies of your work
- Produce good quality work with high standards of grammar and spelling
- Present your work in a suitable format according to the purpose and the audience
- Evaluate your work and make suggestions for improvement
- Meet deadlines
- Keep a record of the work you have completed, including the grades and points you have been awarded

WHO WILL BE INVOLVED?

Mainly your class teacher and the course leader will be involved in the delivery of the course and organising visits and guest speakers.

Working with a range of services will aid understanding and the provision of this will be made where possible to support the course delivery.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least 5 GCSE Grades 9 – 4 or equivalent to include English.
